



# Voce Italiana Grants Winter-Spring 2024-25

## Student Eligibility (2 grants available):

- Students enrolled in the Italian language program in Washington DC universities, including prior grantees.
- Able to work with minimal supervision to research and write articles or interviews with local Italian Americans. Most work to be accomplished remotely, with periodic in-person meetings or at the IAM-DC and Zoom meetings.

### **Terms of Mini-Grant:**

- 2 original articles (research and writing) of 1,000 words each.
- 2 in-person interviews with Italian/Italian-American individuals of interest in DC area (to be assigned by *Voce* Editor).
- All student articles and interviews will be archived in the IAMDC collection. Selected pieces will be published in *Voce Italiana*. Students should expect that their work will be edited and, if selected for publication (under their byline), it will be shortened to fit available space.
- Amount of grant: \$1,000, payable \$250 per completed article/interview (article maybe returned to student for further research).

### **Duration of Mini-Grant:**

Through completion of Winter/Spring Semester 2025.

### **Evaluation/Selection of Candidate:**

- Recommendation by Italian Language or Journalism professor or Grant Committee in the case of prior grantees.
- Subsequent Interview of recommended candidates with CISC/IAMDC Grant Committee.
